Nominations are being accepted to fill the position of one elected police member representative on the PFRSNJ Board of

Trustees, established by P. L. 2018, c. 55 (Chapter 55). The term will begin on February 1, 2025, and will expire on January 31, 2029. Candidates for the position must qualify by electronic nomination. If you wish to declare your interest in running for this position, please send a written request no later than July 5, 2024, to the PFRSNJ Board Secretary at PFRSNJBOT.PoliceNom@treas.nj.gov or to: PFRSNJ Board Secretary, P.O. Box 297, Trenton, NJ 08625-0297.

The PFRSNJ Board of Trustees has the general responsibility for the operation of the PFRS under the provisions of N.J.S.A. 43:16A-13. The Board meets monthly. The statute provides that no employee shall suffer loss of salary or wages because of serving on the Board. A member who wishes to be a candidate for the **police** member position must be an active PFRS **police** member and must receive at least 500 active PFRS **police** member nominations. Only active PFRS **police** members may nominate a candidate for the PFRSNJ Board of Trustees **police** position.

After the candidates have declared their interest in becoming a PFRSNJ Board of Trustee **police** member representative, nominations to support your choice for a candidate are made electronically through a secure website (beginning on or about June 21, 2024). The process is easy and only takes a few minutes. You will need to have access to a computer. Log on to https://vote.yeselections.com/PFRSNJ-Police and follow the simple directions. You will need to provide the last 4 digits of your Social Security number, the first 4 letters of your last name, and your month/year of birth. You will see a list of all the candidates, and then you can make your selection. Please be sure to allow sufficient time for active **police** members to request candidacy and for the vendor to enter the candidate's name to the online system. Nominations must be registered online before 4:00 p.m. on August 2, 2024. If more than one candidate receives 500 or more nominations, an election will be required. Qualified candidates will be invited to attend the drawing by lot for position on the ballot, if necessary, on August 23, 2024. Election ballots will be mailed to PFRS employers for distribution to active members on or about October 18, 2024. **Each member must cast their own ballot**.

PFRSNJ BOARD RESPONSIBILITIES

- Render determinations regarding Disability Retirement cases.
- Review appeals pertaining to the disallowance of pension benefits.
- Establish and Adopt rules and regulations to (a) provide for the payment of benefits and collection of monies as required by the statute and (b) to prevent injustices and inequities that may arise in the operation of the Retirement System within the limitations of statutes and opinions of the Courts.
- Resolve individual questions on the merits of each case in terms of statutes, advice of the Actuary and cases cited by counsel as deliberated by the Courts.
- View monthly and annual reports setting forth data such as assets and liabilities, income and disbursements and statistical summarization of membership as documented by the Actuary.
- The Board is responsible for the funding policies of the Board and directing the investments of the funds.
- Transmit hearing requests to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) and review decisions from the OAL.
