Overview

The graduate programs in Nutrition and Food Science at Montclair State University prepare students for a variety of careers in nutrition, food science and food management. Our programs are unique in that they offer a hybrid approach with strong emphasis on both nutrition and food science, and provide students with learning opportunities in applied nutrition, food management and food science.

Graduates may choose to work in education, research, government, nonprofit or corporate settings. Graduates have attained prestigious positions in a variety of organizations.

Programs

Students may earn the following degrees/certifications:

Master of Science Degree in Nutrition and Food Science

The 32-credit MS in Nutrition and Food Science program provides students with in-depth study of nutrition science, nutrition education and counseling, food science, food management, and food regulations and compliance. It prepares professionals for careers in nutrition and wellness, allied health services, education and research, food and nutrition administration, food production, food safety and regulations, and food and nutrition management.

Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics Certificate

The Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics (A.N.D.) Post-Baccalaureate Certificate Program is designed for students who already have an earned bachelor's or higher degree in any subject area and who wish to become registered dietitians. It requires completion of the undergraduate curriculum in dietetics that is prerequisite to applying for an approved dietetic internship, the next step en route to becoming a registered dietitian. Students who wish to complete the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics Certificate and the M.S. in Nutrition and Food Science simultaneously should consult with an advisor before applying.

Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics Dietetic Internship Program

The Post-Baccalaureate Dietetic Internship Program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, and is a prerequisite to taking the registration examination that is required of individuals who wish to become registered dietitians. The Dietetic Internship Program is dedicated to preparing graduates for excellence in dietetics practice, the nutrition care process, and dynamic professional involvement in the field. Students will be prepared for entry-level positions in dietetics through classroom education and supervised field experiences. The program provides education in all areas of dietetics with a nutrition therapy emphasis so as to achieve the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics competency requirements.



Nutrition and Exercise Science Certificate

The graduate certificate program in Nutrition and Exercise Science provides students the opportunity to gain knowledge in the closely related fields of nutrition and exercise science. The program is designed to develop and enhance competencies necessary for creating applied nutrition and exercise programs for clients interested in wellness and weight management and is ideal for personal trainers, and other professionals who wish to enhance their knowledge in these important areas of health and wellness. Theoretical and practical approaches are emphasized throughout the program.
