CORE CHOICE

- Offers the most flexibility of all our graduate programs in Educational Leadership.
- Select your pace and course format.
- One to four classes in a given term to work within your schedule and budget.
- Diverse number of formats: online (eight-week sessions), hybrid (including weekends) and campus-based instruction.

FAST-TRACK

- Earn the full master's degree with both Principal and Supervisor certifications (if eligible) in 14 months while working full time.
- Cohort-based program runs on a summer-to-summer time schedule (apply for fall or spring starts to begin the Fast-Track Program early before the program begins in earnest during the subsequent summer).
- Classes offered on select weekends and evenings in both online and hybrid formats.
- Three courses a semester but only two at a time.

FULLY ONLINE


- New Jersey's highest rated graduate education online program, *U.S. News & World Report*.
- Mostly asynchronous online course schedule provides convenience and flexibility.
- Offers student engagement within an online format.
- Most courses are approximately eight weeks.

OFF-SITE

 Onsite at districts that have chosen to partner with Montclair, allows students to take their classes close to where you live or in the district where you work.

OFF-SITE AT UNION COLLEGE (36 CR.)

 Begins fall semester with students taking one course at a time, completing two eight-week hybrid courses per semester.

WINNER: 'OSCARS OF TEACHING'

It's little wonder that Taylor Trost's abilities and potential caught the attention of the Milken Family Foundation, which presents annually a prestigious national honor recognizing outstanding educators. Trost has been on a fast track to leadership, stepping into the lead teacher role in her second year in the profession.

When she began thinking about the next steps on her career path, she looked to her school's administrators for guidance. "My principal recommended Montclair's master's program in educational leadership," says Trost, a fourth grade teacher at Grace Norton Rogers Elementary School in Hightstown. "I trusted her advice. I liked that the program was fully online."

Trost, a 2023 graduate, says the MA in Educational Leadership "was rigorous but flexible. The cohort approach created a support system, making it a more social experience than I had expected. We still have group chats to share ideas and opportunities."

The graduate-level coursework prepared Trost to translate her classroom creativity – which included innovations such as a pretend campfire circle to nurture her student's storytelling abilities – into larger initiatives.

Now, when Trost sees an opportunity or wants to develop a new idea, she is better able to move forward. "I have the tools to make more of an impact," she says.

"One of the things I really liked most about the program was the opportunity to connect and network with people around the state," says Tiffany Cohen, who advanced to a Supervisor position after earning her MA in Educational Leadership.


